



AN INVITATION TO MORNING TEA AT WALLACIA POST OFFICE.

On Tuesday 1st April 2008, between 10am and 12 noon, Margaret Fowler and the staff at Wallacia Post Office, will be holding a community morning tea to celebrate the Fowler family's 100 years of service in the Post Office at Wallacia. We are hoping as many members of the community who can make it, will share this occasion with us.

On the 1st April 1908, John Fowler was appointed Postmaster at Wallacia. Prior to that date, the Post Office and General Store (situated where the Wallacia shops are now), had been operated by the Wallace family, after whom the village of Wallacia was named. During this 100 year period, 4 Fowler incumbents aided by a myriad of wonderful people, all worked in the Wallacia Post Office.

Joining with us on the day will be Penrith City Council, Australia Post, the Morsecodian Fraternity and members of the Telstra Museum. An interactive display of old switchboards and other communication technology along with demonstrations of morse code techniques, will be on show. For a small charge, the 'Morse Codians' will send telegrams by Morse Code, typed onto a special Souvenir Form which will be delivered by Australia Post to any destination.
